- Check/sign planners daily.
- Check homework completion.
- Check and sign the Tuesday folder weekly.
- Conference with your child's teacher about ways to improve performance.
- Look at your child's performance and be sure you understand where they stand in reading, writing, math, and science.
- Read with your child nightly.
- Take part in school events.
- Support your child's future and show them education is important.

When you tell your child that you believe in his or her abilities, your child is encouraged to perform well in school and develop through learning.

- The program serves millions of children

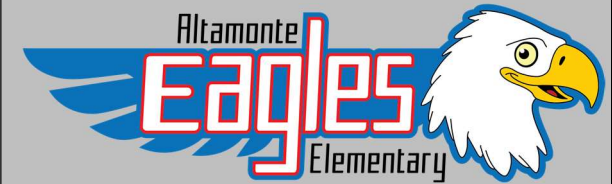

Title 1 schools are required to:

- Develop jointly with parents a written Parent/Family Engagement Plan.
- Hold an annual meeting to inform parents of the school's participation in the Title 1 program and their rights to be involved in school, and to explain the requirements of Title 1.
- Develop jointly with parents a School-Parent compact. The compact must state how parents, the entire school staff and students will share in the achievement and must be discussed during a parent/teacher conference.
- Provide staff training on family engagement and parent involvement.

- Provide training and materials to help parents work with their children.
- Provide timely information to parents about the Title 1 program and offer flexible meeting times.
- Provide (if requested) an opportunity for regular meetings to allow parents to participate (as appropriate) in decisions about their child's education and respond to their questions.
- Ensure that information sent to parents is in a format and language, to the extent practical, that parents can understand.
- Coordinate with other community agencies.
